Health and Safety Plan: A Response to COVID-19



Purpose of the Plan

The Health and Safety Plan is to enact safety and disease mitigation protocols for COVID-19 and ensure a coherent, community - wide, safe approach to opening schools in the Fall of 2022.

This plan was developed in consultation with local health agencies and is unique to the needs of the Weatherly Area School District. This plan will be monitored, revised, and updated throughout the school year until normal operations resume.

As decision makers, we are mindful that as long as there are cases of COVID-19 in the community, there are no strategies that can completely eliminate transmission risk within a school population. The goal is to keep transmission as low as possible to safely continue school activities. This plan is subject to change without Board approval to adhere to released orders or guidance of federal, state, and local authorities.

**Cycling back and forth between less restrictive to more restrictive designations may occur as public health indicators improve or worsen. This plan will be followed until the Pandemic is over.

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Type of Reopening: Learning Options Available for 2022-2023 School Year

Option 1

Full Reopening with "normal" school hours

Option 2: Digital Academy (K-12) *

Students who do not want to attend in-person instruction will have the option to do full virtual using the district's cyber program "WAVE"

This option will enable K-12 students to learn online via WAVE (Weatherly Area Virtual Education). Students will not be expected to attend school in person. All of their classes will take place remotely with state certified educators.

Other Strategies:

Implement standard operating procedures while taking preventative measures such as:

Screening of symptoms of illness (required for bus drivers/monitors prior to entering the school bus)

• symptomatic or sick students and transportation staff will not be permitted on the bus

Provide hand sanitizer for students, and bus driver

• bus drivers will be required to wash hands before and after work shifts

No food or drink allowed on bus

Inspect buses prior to students returning and as part of a regular rotation

Posters encouraging staying at home when sick, covering coughs and sneezes, and washing hands often will be placed on the bus in sight of all passengers

Remote appointments when possible (IEP meetings, college visits, etc.)

Limit visitors to individuals that are essential (district specific).

• Utilize virtual meetings as much as possible (IEP, 504, SAIP, Conferences etc.)

Symptomatic or sick staff, students and visitors will not be permitted into the school

There will be a set protocol for student pick/drop up: staggered entry and release (by grade, class, or bus numbers), marked spacing for pickup and the use of different entry/exit points will be used

Screening of all students will continue daily prior to entry

Screening of all staff will be done once in the building

Create a symptoms checklist for parents to screen students and staff to self-screen daily at home prior to school arrival. Share this checklist directly with all stakeholders.

Incorporate symptoms checklists into morning announcements at middle/high school levels.

Attendance and Superintendent secretaries will monitor student/staff absenteeism rates/patterns and consult with the school nurse. If substantial increase is noted, the local health department will be contacted.

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Enforce that staff and students stay home if they have tested positive for COVID-19, have COVID-19 symptoms or have recent close contact with a person with COVID-19 until they meet criteria to return to work or school.

Staff and students will follow guidance regarding face coverings while in the buildings.

On February 14, 2022, School Board revision amendment read:

Approve to agree that the Weatherly Area School District will update the Health & Safety Plan to make masks optional in all district buildings effective Tuesday, February 22, 2022. Individuals will still be required to wear mask on all public transportation, as well as, the nurse's offices.

February 25, 2022 Federal Mask Mandate is no longer in effect for public transportation.

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Continuum of Screening:



HOME is the first point on the screening continuum. LEAs should educate and support families on identifying the symptoms that indicate staff and students must stay at home. Families should be encouraged to self-report symptoms of illness, which could include fever, new onset of cough, etc. Self-reporting mechanisms could include calling the school, calling

health-care provider, etc.



TRANSPORTATION is the second point on the screening continuum. LEAs should use clearly visible signage to communicate the symptoms students should not have if traveling on a school bus.



SCHOOL is the final point on the screening continuum. LEA staff should visually check for symptoms (which may include temperature checks) and/or confirm with families that students are COVID-19 symptom-free. *Follow up with healthcare professional.

Hand sanitizer readily available and/or children may bring individual bottles of hand sanitizer to keep on desk or in a backpack.
